Scout – best against rusts and eyespot

Disease resistance

The disease resistance of Scout is excellent, particularly to eyespot where it is the only variety on the RL to score a 9, and both yellow and brown rust. Importantly it also has resistance to orange wheat blossom midge (OWBM).

General information

Scout joins the 2009/10 HGCA Recommended List as the only new Group 3 variety for biscuit and export. With the areas of Robigus, Zebedee, Consort and Claire in decline and with its superb agronomic characters, Scout will undoubtedly be popular both for milling and the large export market and should be the variety in demand this year and beyond.

Grain quality

Scout has been provisionally classified **UKS** for export. With a specific weight of 77.7, the highest of any soft wheat varieties, and an impressive hagberg even in poor seasons, Scout has superb grain characteristics, ensuring a strong position in the premium biscuit and export markets which equate to around 3.5-4.5 million tonnes.

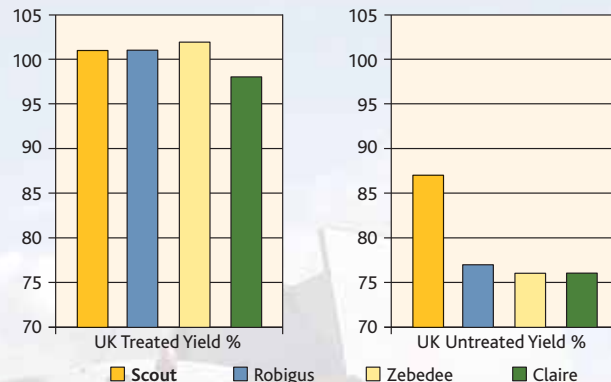

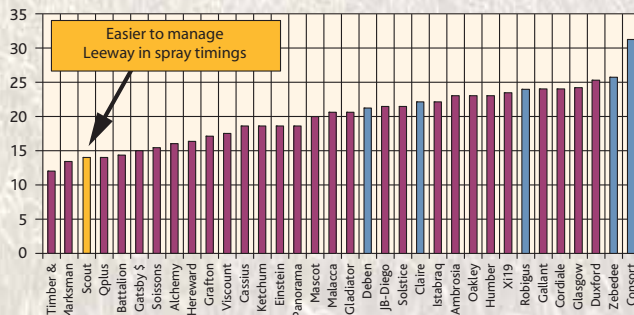
